

Irregular “YO” form verb song

Examples

Decir, Tener, Venir and Oír have other changes not just the “yo” form.
All other verbs listed in the song are irregular in the “yo” form only.

Saber = To Know Facts and Information/To Know How To Do Something	Sé Sabes Sabe	Sabemos Saben
Oír = To Hear	Oigo Oyes Oye	Oímos Oyen
Tener = To Have (semi-shoe verb)	Tengo Tienes Tiene	Tenemos Tienen
Venir = To Come (semi-shoe verb)	Vengo Vienes Viene	Venimos Vienen
Decir = To Say/To Tell (semi-shoe verb)	Digo Dices Dice	Decimos Dicen
Dar = To Give	Doy Das Da	Damos Dan
Ver = To See	Veo Ves Ve	Vemos Ven
